

This KM explains the locations generally used by most ICBS caches.

End User Solution

In general most caches will have the following locations created in ICBS:

- **STOR1**, Location name for Items on the shelves. Cache could also have **STOR2**, **STOR3**, **BULK**, **OUTSIDE**.
- **RETURN-1**, Designated virtual zone for the return process. RFI items are systematically moved from this location to the appropriate location for movement to the storage location. Users should never access this location for any purpose.
- **GENERAL-REFURB-1**, one of the possible locations where a return that is NRFI is sent. Depending on the refurbishment type the location could be **LAUNDRY-1**, **TOOL-2** and so forth.
- **SHIP-SORT01**, Location where items that have been picked for an outbound order are moved. From this location the items are packed and shipped.
- **V1-000001**, Location for value added service. This location is where inventory is moved for the kitting or dekitting processes.
- **OF** or **Overflow** – locations where inventory is moved that does not have a dedicated storage location or is in excess of what the dedicated storage location will hold.
- **Bulk Zones (B4103)** etc. Locations that will hold large quantity of inventory. The inventory in these locations must be dedicated to this location.
