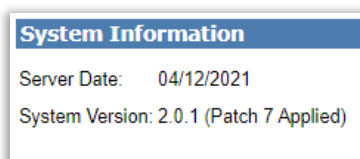
Important Things to Know Prior to Installing e-ISuite Site 2.0.1 Patch 7

- **Google Chrome is the only supported browser.**
- Only apply this patch to e-ISuite Site Version 2.0.1 Production. All changes from Patch 1-6 are included in Patch 7.
- Backup all databases before applying the patch.
- Close all browser windows and ensure there are no active connections to the e-ISuite Server.
- System Administrative privileges **are** required to install this patch. Users will need to follow their agency protocol for installing software.
- The version number will not be updated with this patch. A message stating "(Patch 7 Applied)" will display on the Home Page near the System Version. This will be confirmation that the patch is installed.
- Users **must** clear their browser cache after installing e-ISuite Site 2.0.1 Patch 7. Instructions for clearing the browser cache in Chrome can be found here: [Clearing Chrome Browser Cache](#).

Steps for Installation

1. Download the Site 2.0.1 Patch 7 from the Site Downloads page on the e-ISuite Webpage: <https://famit.nwccg.gov/applications/eISuite/general/downloads>
2. Install the patch using your agency protocol for installing software.
3. Reboot your computer.
4. Clear your browser cache. See instructions above on clearing the browser cache in Google Chrome.
5. Log into e-ISuite Site.
